

RED SEAL TAX CREDIT – 10% of wages, up to a maximum of \$2,000 per year, for Red Seal apprentices for the first

BASIC TAX CREDIT - 20% of wages, up to a maximum of \$4,000 per year, for non-Red Seal apprentices for the first two years.

COMPLETION TAX CREDIT - additional tax credits for employers that hire apprentices who are First Nations or have disabilities.

EMPLOYER TRAINING GRANT - up to two-thirds of the cost of training a employee, with a maximum of \$10,0

APPRENTICESHIP SERVICE SUPPORTS

Employers hiring new first-year apprentices in Red Seal trades can get up to \$10,000.
